Dear Parents and Guardians,

With the ongoing pandemic in Ontario, and the recent announcement of schools remaining closed to most in-person learning for the remainder of the school year, I want to provide you with clarification about year-end recognition events for students and information about retrieving personal belongings from your school and dropping off of school resources.

End of Year Ceremonies

In an effort to provide a personalized graduation experience, while still adhering to safety measures, all of our schools have already planned an in-person portion for graduation celebrations for our Grade 12 students.
